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To Whom This May Concern:

We have reviewed the Code of Federal Regulations 16 CFR 1602 to 1632, Subchapter D – Flammable Fabrics Act Regulations. Our pediatric sleepwear is flame resistant according to this regulation.

At this time, the following products meet the regulation due the following exemptions:

Exemption for blankets due to:

Per "16 CFR 1610.37 (d) (1) Plain surface fabrics, regardless of fiber content, weighing 2.6 ounces per square yard or more."

Exemption of 100% polyester fabrics due to:

Per "16 CFR 1610.37 (d) (2) All fabrics, both plain surface and raised-fiber surface, regardless of weight, made entirely from any of the following fibers or entirely from combination of the following fibers: acrylic, modacrylic, nylon, olefin, polyester, wool."

Exemption for baby shirts due to:

Per "16 CFR 1615.1 (a) (2) "Infant garment" means a garment which: (c) is sized for a child nine months of age or smaller

In addition, the State of California requires the following for examination gowns and sleepwear:

Per California Title 19, Div. 1, Chapter 7, Article 2 " Examination Gowns and Sleepwear. Fabric or fabric-like material in examination gowns and sleepwear shall be tested in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 4, Standard Number 702-1975 of the National Fire Protection Association and shall have an average time of burning of 8.0 seconds or more. Exceptions: 1) smooth-surfaced fabrics (without nap or pile) weighing 4.0 ounces per square yard or more. Weight shall be determined in accordance with ASTM D1910. "

Please keep in mind that some products are inherently flame resistant, such as polyester, and we can review these items on an individual basis. You may wish to review your state guidelines to see if they have any additional requirements. If you have any further questions or comments, please feel free to contact me.
